PRIDE IN RECOGNITION

The Performance Enhancement Group recently completed a survey of more than 700 advancement professionals around the country. One of the questions they asked was to name alumni associations they feel are strong benchmarks for the industry. The report reflected that the Mizzou Alumni Association was mentioned enough times to rank in the **top tier** (top ten, basically) of associations in the nation.

Other associations in the top tier were Penn State, Ohio State, North Carolina, Michigan, Texas A&M, Texas, and Illinois among a couple of others. That is a great peer assessment of the Mizzou Alumni Association. K-State ranked in tier two; Nebraska and KU ranked in the third tier.

NEW AWARDS

The alumni association has added two new awards to its volunteer of the year awards program. This year, in addition to the Mizzou G.O.L.D. and Tiger Pride awards, the association will accept nominations for two Alumni Legacy Awards.

The Legacy Awards recognize one in-state and one out-of-state volunteer leader for lifetime exemplary service to the Association. Criteria are:

A. Recipients must be members of the Mizzou Alumni Association and not curently serving on the Association's Governing Board at the time of their nomination. Previous Tiger Pride and/or Mizzou G.O.L.D. recipients may be eligible for nomination.

B. Recipients will have demonstrated a minimum of 35 years of continuous and exemplary service, dedication and loyalty to the Association and University through local chapter, affiliated organization and/or national Association involvement. Direct monetary contributions to the University and the nominee's category of membership shall not be criteria for selection.

Nominations are due by May1.

TIGER CHALLENGE

Mizzou is squaring off with two other tiger rivals – Auburn University and Clemson University – in a battle to stop tiger farming and the illegal trade in tiger parts. The three universities have joined with the World Wildlife Fund (WWF) in a friendly competition to see which school can raise the most funds to help save our magnificent mascot in the wild.

While the Tigers for Tigers Challenge was launched in friendly rivalry, the threats facing the world's tiger population are deadly serious. Students, faculty, alumni, and fans are encouraged to show their true stripes by helping Mizzou win this competition.
