Frequently Asked Questions:

May I bring my spouse/significant other to the reunion?

Yes, reunion attendees are encouraged to bring a guest with them.

The graduate being honored is a member of the Alumni Association, yet the spouse is not. Which couple registration pricing applies?

As long as one individual is a member, the couple may register using the "Member Couple" pricing.

What does the school/college visit entail?

Each school/college designs a unique visit for their graduates. Most often, a tour of the current buildings housing the main department is given. Graduates receive an update from the Dean about the progress and pride points of the school/college. Graduates are also given the opportunity to meet current faculty, staff and students. Some colleges prefer to use this opportunity as a "back to class" setting where alumni attend classes or have a professor come in to "conduct class" with the group.

Will there be time to shop for Mizzou gear?

You bet! There will be time on Monday afternoon to visit the University Bookstore in the newly renovated Brady Commons. On Monday and Tuesday, the Bookstore's hours are 8 a.m.–7 p.m. if you find yourself with some free time. Be sure to bring your Alumni Association membership card. Members get discounts at the Bookstore, Team Store, other stores, and restaurants in town.
